As used on this 2019 Gainful Employment disclosure, Walden's "normal time to complete" is the median time to completion for students who completed the program in 2017-2018 ("median time"). This program will cost \$63,000 with an estimated cost of \$3,301 for books and supplies if completed within normal time. There may be additional costs for living expenses. These costs were accurate at the time of posting, but may have changed.

Program costs reflect current tuition, excluding any scholarship or tuition reductions, and the stated program length. Other costs may include living expenses, which are not charged by or paid to Walden. Program length is based on performance of past graduates; continuously enrolled full-time students are more likely to complete in the time frame listed. Time to completion and cost are not estimates of individual experience and will vary based on factors including but not limited to: individual progress; credit load per term; credits transferred; major changes; unsuccessful course completion; tuition increases; leaves of absence; writing, research and editing skills; job obligations; health issues, care-giving responsibilities, or other personal circumstances.
